Cell Phones, Tablets, Airpods, etc.

Adults will have their cell phones with them in case of emergencies. We know students like having devices for the bus ride. We recommend not bringing anything brand new or of great value. Use caution. Airpods are often lost on these trips, especially on buses. Phones have been lost and broken. Though everyone is welcome to bring them, we are not responsible for lost, broken, or stolen items.

Code of Conduct

In order to protect the integrity of this trip, we require that every student and their parent agree to the Code of Conduct. If the Code of Conduct is violated during the trip, disciplinary action will be taken that could include being immediately removed from the trip. This decision will be made at the discretion of the WC Students Co-Directors with counsel from the Co-Senior Pastors if necessary. There will be zero tolerance for pranks, bullying, possession of illegal substances, weapons, or any other illegal activity.

Check in Sunday Morning

In order to keep every student and adult safe and undistracted from the heart and focus on this trip, there will be detection dogs during check in on Sunday morning. A private company has been hired to make sure there are no prohibited items taken on this trip. They will inspect both luggage and carry-ons. Please make sure your student knows there will be zero tolerance.

No Tool Buckets

For many years, students purchased tool buckets filled with their own individual tools. Several years ago, Jared Smith created a new method where people no longer need to purchase and bring individual tools and tool buckets. Instead, we have large Husky containers for each work group that will have enough tools for that work site. To help us to continue with this method and keep everyone from having to purchase or bring a tool bucket, we ask everyone to donate tools. These donations will be allocated BY LAST NAME to make it as even as possible for everyone. The assigned donation will be sent out to everyone in July.

Note: *Please label everything* you can with your name. There is a possibility you may not come back with all your student's tools, so please do not bring expensive tools.

Workgroups

Workgroups will consist of 10-12 students and 2 adult leaders who will co-lead students in executing projects throughout the week. Students are assigned to workgroups with the intention of providing an opportunity to grow in community. This means students will likely be assigned to a workgroup that consists of people they are already friends with along with others they do not know as well. Workgroups will execute a variety of projects that could include home repair (framing, installing/finishing drywall, flooring, painting, etc.), yard work, neighborhood beautification, and community development.

Check in Procedure

- 1. Come to the top of the hill in the back parking lot of the church at 6:30 a.m. Please park your car as far from the entrance to the church as possible. There will be a lot of moving pieces in the parking lot that morning, so please be patient.
- 2. There will be tents set up. Bring all your luggage to these tents. Your student will go to the tent that corresponds with the first letter of their last name (A-D, E-L, M-R, S-Z). There they will receive their bus assignment and can label their luggage.
- *If you are on our Fast Pass list, you will also receive your t-shirt, nametag, and sign for the photo booth station.
- 3. We will have a luggage drop zone for each bus. Please take your luggage to the bus you have been assigned and put it in the designated area. Keep any carry-ons with you.
- 4. *If you are NOT eligible for our Fast Pass, you will need to head inside to Evans concourse to the first set of tables to check in and receive your t-shirt, nametag, and sign for the photo booth station.
- *If you are eligible for our Fast Pass, you will skip step 4 and proceed to step 5.
- 5. After either dropping your luggage or visiting the first set of tables in the concourse, you will have your photo taken at the photo booth station.
- 6. Adult leaders will also need to visit the adult volunteer table to pick up their adult volunteer folder if they were not at our meeting on Sunday.
- 7. Finally, all students can find a seat in Evans Hall and wait there until we give our final announcements and load the buses. We ask that you please stay in Evans once you have completed check-in. We ask that everyone be patient as we will be checking in over 300 people.

Medications

We are asking that all student prescriptions be dropped off at 8 a.m. on Saturday, July 13 during tool loading. We will have a tent set up that will be stationed by our medical team. Please bring ONLY that week's medicine (not a full container) in the original Prescription container with the prescription label. Labels will be available that will allow each person to write out the name of the prescription, dosage, and frequency. Adult leaders will distribute medications each day as required. We will bring basic medications like Ibuprofen, Tylenol, Sudafed, etc., so students are not permitted to bring any OTC medications. Students should keep their epi pens and inhalers with them at all times in case they need them.
